

NRR PARENT CODE OF CONDUCT

The State of New Jersey Model Athletic Code of Conduct is promulgated in accordance with the provisions of NJSIAA Chapter 74, N.S.D.A. 5:17-2 and is adopted in part and incorporated as follows into the NRR Code of Conduct.

Interscholastic and youth sports programs play an important role in promoting the physical, social and emotional development of children. It is therefore essential for parents, coaches and officials to encourage youth athletes to embrace the values of good sportsmanship. Moreover, adults involved in youth sports events should be models of good sportsmanship and should lead by example by demonstrating fairness, respect and self-control.

No youth rower may register or participate in any NRR program without parental acknowledgement and consent to the NRR Parent Code of Conduct, inclusive of a Zero Tolerance Policy applicable toward coaches, other parents, participants, officials or any other attendee, which must be adhered to at all times, both in substance and intent, by all parents without exception as follows:

1. I will not engage in unsportsmanlike conduct; nor will I encourage my child, or any other person, to engage in unsportsmanlike conduct;
2. I will not engage in any behavior which would endanger the health, safety or well-being of any coach, parent, player, participant, official or any other attendee; nor will I encourage my child, or any other person, to engage in such behaviors;
3. I will not engage in the use of profanity; nor will I encourage my child, or any other person, to engage in the use of profanity;
4. I will treat any coach, parent, player, participant, official or any other attendee with respect; and I will encourage my child to do the same;
5. I will not engage in verbal or physical threats or abuse; nor will I encourage my child, or any other person, to engage in verbal or physical threats or abuse;
6. I will not initiate a fight or scuffle; nor will I encourage my child, or any other person, to initiate a fight or scuffle;
7. If a rower informs the coaches or coaches become aware of an injury, that prevents the rower from participating in a practice, the coaches will let the parent liaison know and he/she will contact parents;
8. If a rower is not able to practice due to injury, a doctor's note is required. A doctor's note of parental consent to resume practice will also be required;
9. If a rower is injured at practice or a boat flips, coaches will let the parent liaison know and he/she will contact parents;

10. In the event of a true emergency coaches should call parents or emergency contact first, then advise parent liaison;

11. The parent liaison will report all incident/injury information to the board.

I hereby agree that if I fail to conform my conduct to the foregoing I will be subject to disciplinary action, including but not limited to the following in any order or combination:

Verbal and/or written warning, immediate ejection and/or permanent suspension from NRR Youth Program events/membership, and expulsion from NRR Youth Program/membership. Disciplinary decisions may be appealed to the NRR Board of Trustees.
